I. Call to Order and introductions

Public Comment

A visitor shared her concerns regarding diversion rates and access for African American and Latino youth.

II. JJDPC involvement, opportunities and activities

- A. Commission Police Dept. Inspections
 - i. San Rafael
 - A. Don and Melissa inspected SRPD, but were not able to get all of their questions answered. A follow-up visit is required.
- B. Youth Officers Roundtable potential next training
 - i. Beverly will follow up with the International Association of Chiefs of Police to learn about training opportunities.
 - ii. A sub-committee will form (Beverly, Don, etc.) to create the workshop
 - iii. We may need a larger venue, depending upon the content
 - iv. It was suggested that in the future, every new officer in the County receive a training from the JJDPC

C. Reviewing diversion data

- There was discussion regarding the need to collect and better understand the arrest and diversion data. There has been a disparity in the information shared with the Commission.
- Discussion continued about the value of a shared data collection system, to better understand and track the needs of youth and families.
- iii. After receiving and reviewing additional data, it was suggested that we attend the Chiefs meeting, to share findings.
- iv. Cindy Ayala shared that there is a future possibility of including more youth in Restorative Justice (through the Probation program)

D. An idea from our Youth Commissioners

Empowering Youth – "Know Your Rights" training

Melissa spoke about creating a "Know your Rights" assembly to be piloted at San Rafael High School and Terra Linda High School. The Commission and guests shared resources.

i. The Juvenile Hall snapshot was shared, followed by a brief discussion regarding teaching staff and tablets.

B. Youth Court

- i. Youth Court is now using 2 Civic Center Courtrooms.

- iv. Youth Court is now the Restorative Response for the Social Host Ordinance
