II.	Topics of Discussion	4:45 - 5:05 pm
	A. Least Restrictive Programs (LRP's) for Marin Youth	
	1. A Least Restrictive Program is a less restrictive alternative to detention.	
	LRPs for Secure Track youth do not necessarily require a facility.	
	2. STRTP: consider mental health issues to place in the appropriate program	
	3. Marin needs to have an agreement for cost coverage with other counties for residential treatment programs and mental health costs	
	4. Group Homes vs. STRTP	
	a) STRTP = short-term (after 6 months: guardian, transitional housing, going home, range of options)	
	b) Probation: enter care later (12-25, mean age 16)	
	c) Dependency: much younger	
	5. Balance placing youth back into the same hostile environment, with the stability of family, etc	
	6. For secure track:	
	a) The court needs to decide	
	b) not a given that a youth who commits a certain level of felony will go on a Secure Track	
	7. Types of secure settings:	
	a) MOU with Sonoma and El Dorado counties	
	b) need to make sure facilities have the resources that match the offense	
	8. Section 875 of Welfare Institutions Code; AB 2361	

- B. Strip Searches in Juvenile Detention
 - 1. Searches: Title 15
 - a) Level of authorization/documentation for strip searches
 - 2. Title 22 requirements (drugs found in the facility, weapons)
 - a) Body scanners: Marin JV does not have
 - b) If drugs are found:
 - 1) If objective facts indicate that juvenile has drugs, weapons, or contraband, a sweep search can be conducted.
 - 2) Drugs are usually found at intake when kids are transitioning into the facility.
 - 3. Liability of fentanyl
 - a) Narcan on-site

III. Juvenile Hall updates 5:05-5:30 pm

- A. Youth in custody
 - 1) 8 youth in custody
 - 2) 3 pending placement in STRTP
 - 3) 7 youth in STRTP after the three transitions
 - 4) Several are pending in court for issues that need to be resolved
 - 5) 7 males, one female
 - a) Try to be responsive to single females' needs to be met by staff
 - 6) In Marin, 80 percent male in JV
