OPENING ON MARIN COUNTY BOARD OF PAROLE COMMISSIONERS

The Marin County Superior Court is seeking a Marin County resident to serve as a citizen representative on the Marin County Board of Parole Commissioners. The Board consists of the Sheriff, the Probation Supervisor, and a citizen member, not a public official, selected by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court.

The mission of the Marin County Board of Parole Commissioners is to provide offenders serving jail sentences with the opportunity to become productive citizens through early controlled release programs focused on treatment and rehabilitation.

The Marin County Parole Program was adopted in 1988 by the Marin County Board of Supervisors to relieve jail overcrowding and provide defendants with the opportunity to successfully integrate into the community through effective, evidence-based supervision tools proven to minimize risk and maintain public safety.

The citizen representative is a part-time volunteer position that requires a two-year commitment, one year serving as the primary representative and one year serving as an alternate representative.

Responsibilities include preparation for and attendance at weekly parole board hearings and review of parole summaries. The Board meets regularly each Wednesday morning at the Marin County Jail, starting at 8:00 a.m.
