This matter comes before the Court on Petitioner/Mother's Request for Order (RFO), filed December 21, 2023, that she be allowed to move with the children to Florida. Based on the information before the Court, it appears that the best interest of the parties' minor children, Ananna, born June 1, 2013, London, born December 29, 2014, and Joline, born May 26, 2016, will be served by the Court adopting the recommendations of Family Court Services (FCS) in its report issued on February 9, 2024, as modified by the Court. The Court will do so and the parenting plan is set forth below:

**PARENTING PLAN:**

All prior orders not in conflict with the below shall remain in full force and effect with the following modifications.

1. Mother's request to move the children to Florida is denied.
2. If Mother moves to Florida:
  - a. The children shall be placed in the primary physical custody of Father during the school year.
  - b. Mother may visit with the children in California as often she is able to.
  - c. The children shall be in Mother's custody for the summers and major school breaks.

As authorized by CRC 5.125, the Court will prepare the formal order after hearing.
